Police numbers have decreased on the Tweed, but overtime hours have increased. This means that Police will still be able to apply the spontaneous foot patrols in and around Uki village. The focus of these patrols will be observation of hooning, as there are residents of Uki who still persist in driving at 80 km per hour in the school zone, doing burnouts near children's playgrounds and parking on the corner on both sides of Rowlands Ck Rd, outside the Uki Cafe.

The other focus of Police in Uki Village is the behaviour of some of our young people, and of particular attention to the complaints to Police about their drug use. Police are able to search teenagers who are deemed to be displaying suspicious activity, and have assured Neighbourhood Watch that they will be doing so.

A group of vigilant parents have been working in conjunction with Police in order to keep Uki free from problematic behaviour that affects us all as a community.
