These 2 hours 4 times a year make it viable for us to continue, we are the only Neighbourhood Watch in Murwillumbah, please let us know if you have any ideas

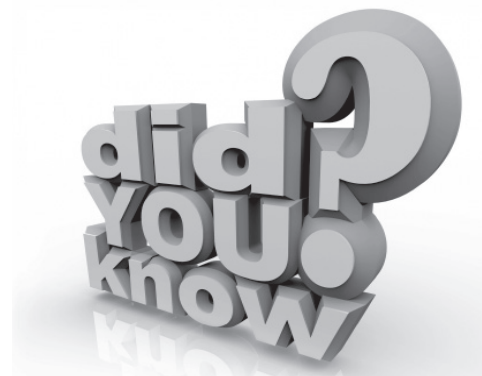
for guest speakers, your attendance and input is always appreciated.

PHONE NUMBERS AUTOMATICALLY REGISTERED - you don't even have to talk to anyone!!

I certainly hope you are all reporting anything that has happened in your street, there are quite a few incidents just outside our area which extends west from Barnby street to all the new areas, **PLEASE KEEP WATCH OVER YOUR NEIGHBOURS.**

Many police arrests are due to help from neighbours and residents, keep watch just as you expect your neighbours to watch out for your property.

This service provides for the frail, the aged and or those with disabilities and their carers. Volunteer drivers provide this great community service.

A good idea is to have your doctor, hospital and local police number next to the phone or taped on the phone and make sure your children know where it is.

Every minute counts in an emergency

6 ways to protect your home from summer storm damage:

- 1) Keep the yard clear of clutter
 - 2) Trim overhanging branches
 - 3) Clean downpipes and gutters
 - 4) Prepare emergency kit
 - 5) Check roof for damage
 - 6) Listen for local weather reports
