What do I do if I see Graffiti on my property?

If you find graffiti on your property, your first priority should be to report this through the NSW Police Force Community Portal or other police reporting channels.

This is easily completed after registering with Service NSW and linking with the NSW Police Force or logging in with an existing account.

After the graffiti is reported, it is important to remove this graffiti. If graffiti is left in an area, more graffiti often appears. Removing the graffiti quickly can often act as a deterrent for graffiti offenders as their crime is not seen by their peers.

Can I report any Graffiti I see?

You can submit reports for the NSW Police Force Community Portal on behalf of another person or an organisation.

However, making a police report is the responsibility of an interested person or organisation. That organisation or person may request you to submit this report.

This could be an employee or representative of a business/organisation or for personal property of a relative, friend or carer.

If you intend to submit the report on behalf of an organisation or another person, ensure you have authority or consent to do this.

This will ensure the NSW Police Force do not receive multiple reports for the same incident.

How can I stop or reduce the Graffiti in my area?

- Recognise Graffiti is a crime!
- ♦ Don't become immune to its presence.
- Report Graffiti through the NSW Police Force Community Portal or other NSW Police Force channels.
- Remove the graffiti as quickly as possible.

Graffiti vandals may seek recognition and attention from their peers.

Graffiti that is not removed quickly will often have further graffiti near the original site.

Quick removal of graffiti may deter future graffiti crime as offenders do not receive the recognition from other graffiti offenders.
